I. CONSISTENCY OF BUSINESS PLAN WITH COUNTRY PARTNERSHIP STRATEGY

1. The country operations business plan (COBP), 2020–2022 of the Asian Development Bank (ADB) for Bhutan is consistent with ADB's draft country partnership strategy, 2019–2023¹ for Bhutan, the Government's priority areas articulated in the Twelfth Five-Year Plan (2018–2023),² and operational priorities of ADB's Strategy 2030.³ The COBP aligns with the three country partnership strategy pillars, which aim to (i) promote dynamic economic reforms, (ii) improve connectivity for better access to information and markets, and (iii) achieve greater inclusiveness through more equitable socioeconomic development. These pillars are aligned closely with the government's key priorities. The COBP adopts a focused and differentiated approach to a country that is small and landlocked, aiming to create quality jobs by fostering small and medium-sized enterprises and inclusive businesses.

II. INDICATIVE RESOURCE PARAMETERS

- 2. Bhutan, a group A developing member country, is eligible for Asian Development Fund (ADF) grants and concessional ordinary capital resources lending (COL). The indicative ADF grant and COL resource allocation for commitment for 2020–2022 are \$232.56 million.⁴ The final allocation will depend on available resources and the outcome of the country performance assessments. Cofinancing and funding from other sources, including the regional pool under concessional resources, will be explored. The 2018 debt distress classification of Bhutan was assessed to be at moderate risk of debt distress.
- 3. The proposed indicative pipeline of ADB lending and nonlending products for the 2020–2022 program reflects a balanced program of infrastructure investment projects and institutional reform programs to promote a resilient and diversified economy. The estimated total ADB financing for the proposed lending pipeline for 2020–2022 is \$502.00 million, which will be sourced from COL (from both performance-based country allocation and the disaster risk reduction (DRR) mechanism), ADF DRR grants, and ordinary capital resources and subregional COL.⁵ The final amount of assistance will depend on availability of resources and project readiness. In addition, a \$3.00 million grant from the Japan Fund for Poverty Reduction is allocated for the Solar Photovoltaic Renewable Energy Pilot Project in 2020. To complement the sovereign operations, ADB will explore nonsovereign investments from its Private Sector Operations Department for bankable projects in agribusiness, finance, infrastructure, and tourism. Total ADB financing for the proposed nonlending pipeline for 2020–2022 is estimated at \$8.73 million, of which \$6.73 million will be allocated from the Technical Assistance Special Fund, and \$2.00 million will come from the Japan Fund for Poverty Reduction.
- 4. The country assistance results areas (Appendix 1) provide directions on the allocation of sector resources. Appendix 2 shows Bhutan's portfolio at a glance. The indicative pipeline of lending and nonlending products for 2020–2022 is in Appendix 3. The assistance program for 2019 is in Appendix 4. Appendix 5 lists indicative knowledge products that seek to respond to Bhutan's priority knowledge needs.
