I. CONSISTENCY OF BUSINESS PLAN WITH COUNTRY PARTNERSHIP STRATEGY

- 1. The country operations business plan (COBP), 2020–2022 of the Asian Development Bank (ADB) for the Lao People's Democratic Republic (Lao PDR) is consistent with ADB's country partnership strategy (CPS) 2017–2020 for the Lao PDR. The 2020–2022 lending program extends beyond the current country partnership strategy but continues the focus on three strategic priorities: (i) infrastructure and private sector development to support employment and income generation, (ii) enhanced human resource development, and (iii) sustainable natural resource management and climate resilience. Gender equity and governance are crosscutting themes. The COBP will also focus on inclusive and sustainable development in line with the operational priorities of ADB's Strategy 2030: (i) making cities more livable by easing infrastructure constraints and providing urban services; (ii) improving human capital to reduce inequality in access to opportunities, and facilitating the creation of quality jobs; (iii) enhancing rural development and food security; and (iv) providing climate- and disaster-resilient infrastructure and services. Targeted investments across projects will mainstream activities to support gender equality, good governance, innovative knowledge solutions, and policy and institutional reforms. The projects will also contribute to the attainment of several Sustainable Development Goals in the Lao PDR.
- 2. The COBP, 2020–2022 also supports implementation of the government's 8th National Socio-Economic Development Plan (2016–2020);² the Ha Noi Action Plan, 2018–2022; and the Regional Investment Framework 2022 for the Greater Mekong Subregion (GMS).³

II. INDICATIVE RESOURCE PARAMETERS

- 3. The Lao PDR, a group A developing member country, is eligible for ADB concessional resources. ⁴ The indicative resources available for commitment for 2020–2022 total \$322.6 million, ⁵ including \$45.0 million from the disaster risk reduction resources, comprising \$30.0 million in concessional ordinary capital resources lending (COL), and \$15.0 million in Asian Development Fund grant resources. Cofinancing and funding from other sources, including the regional pool under concessional resources, will be explored.
- 4. The International Monetary Fund's Debt Sustainability Analysis (DSA) 2019 classified Lao PDR's public and external debt positions at the same category as in its 2018 report: *high* risk of debt distress. However, the 2019 analysis notes that large electricity export revenues under long-term power purchasing agreements with neighboring countries and expanding electricity export markets will help mitigate risks, and keep debt sustainability outlook sustainable.
- 5. Lending operations cover the following: water supply and urban services (28.1%); agriculture, natural resources and rural development (26.8%); health (13.7%); public sector management (12.1%); transport (10.7%); and energy (8.6%). Lending operations also contribute

to strengthening governance and institutional capacity. Appendix 1 lists the areas of assistance and the resource allocation for each sector. Although excluded in Appendix 1, support to the education sector will be through a technical and vocational education and training project on standby in 2022. The nonlending program for 2020–2022 will support project preparation and implementation, capacity development, and knowledge work. As agreed with the government, areas of assistance for the water and other urban infrastructure services sector have been added, to follow a sector or thematic instead of a project-based approach through multitranche financing facilities.

6. Total cost of the lending pipeline is \$427.6 million for firm projects, while the total cost of the regional nonlending pipeline in which the Lao PDR will participate is \$46.5 million⁷. Appendix 3 lists the lending and nonlending program for 2020–2022 and Appendix 4 outlines the lending and nonlending programs for 2019. Project readiness remains an important criterion in selecting projects and programs for earlier processing, regardless of their status as firm or standby. ADB will closely collaborate with local knowledge institutions—including think tanks, universities and research institutes—to disseminate knowledge and provide the key knowledge products for 2020 (Appendix 5).

III. SUMMARY OF CHANGES TO LENDING AND NONLENDING PROGRAMS

- 7. **Changes in 2020.** ADB advanced the Quality Health Care Project with a reduced amount (from \$40.0 million to \$35.0 million), and included the Water Supply and Sanitation Project with an allocated amount of \$31.3 million, as requested by the government. ADB renamed the GMS Cross-Border Power Trade and Distribution project as the Rural Power Distribution and Efficiency Improvement Project, with a reduced amount (from \$80.0 million to \$32.0 million),⁸ and changed the title and modality of the GMS Flood and Drought Risk Management and Mitigation Project (Additional Financing) to the Water Management Project, with planned approval in 2021.
- 8. **Changes in 2021.** ADB included the Water Management Project as firm in 2021, and the GMS Cross-Border Livestock Health and Value Chains Improvement Project as standby for 2021. ADB also renamed the GMS Universal Health Care Project to the GMS Healthy Border in Special Economic Zones Project, and the Luang Prabang Integrated Sanitation Project to the Livable Cities Investment Program-Tranche 1.

All the technical assistance (TA) for project preparation and implementation, capacity development, and knowledge work will be provided through large regional TA projects or regional transaction TA facilities, with a sector or thematic focus.
