I. CONSISTENCY OF BUSINESS PLAN WITH COUNTRY PARTNERSHIP STRATEGY

1. The country partnership strategy (CPS) of the Asian Development Bank (ADB) for Myanmar, 2017–2021 supports the government in achieving sustainable and inclusive economic development, and creating jobs to reduce poverty.¹ ADB support focuses on (i) improving access and connectivity to link Myanmar to regional and global markets; (ii) building human resources and capacity to enhance competitiveness; and (iii) promoting structural and policy reforms to transform and modernize the economy, and strengthen public and private institutions. These are in line with the government's strategic directions in the Myanmar Sustainable Development Plan (MSDP) 2018–2030 and ADB's Strategy 2030.² The priorities under ADB's CPS, 2017–2021 remain valid for the country operations business plan (COBP), 2020-2022. ADB operations will support key operational priorities from Strategy 2030: addressing remaining poverty and reducing inequalities through infrastructure (energy and transport) as well as education and training and healthcare; building climate and disaster resilience through appropriate infrastructure and livelihood support; making cities more livable through urban infrastructure and services; promoting rural development and food security focusing on community development; strengthening governance and institutional capacity including public sector management and private sector development; and fostering regional cooperation and integration for the provision of regional public goods. The key result areas for ADB assistance in each sector in 2020–2022 are presented in Appendix 1.

2. ADB will intensify support to capacity development and governance, private sector development, environment and climate change, disaster risk management, regional cooperation, and gender equity. ADB's concessional sovereign lending and its market-based finance for the private sector will help fill the country's investment deficit. ADB will continue collaborating actively with other development partners through policy dialogue, project-related work, and knowledge support.

3. In line with the CPS, ADB will continue to adopt a conflict-sensitive approach in its projects. ADB assistance will (i) minimize risk of doing harm to ongoing conflict, (ii) contribute to inclusive development through equitable benefits to all communities, and (iii) ensure continuity of projects despite local conflict. To achieve this, the design of ADB projects must include measures that ensure project-affected people of all ethnic groups are properly informed about the project, involved in project decision-making, and given equal opportunity to participate in and obtain project benefits.

II. INDICATIVE RESOURCE PARAMETERS

4. Myanmar, a group A developing member country, is eligible for concessional ordinary capital resources lending (COL) and Asian Development Fund (ADF) grants set aside for specific purposes. The resources available for commitment to Myanmar in 2020–2022 is \$1,313.44 million, including \$45.0 million from the disaster risk reduction (DRR) resources, of which \$30.0 million is from COL and \$15.0 million is from ADF grant. Additional resources of \$50.0 million from the COL regional set aside is also granted to Myanmar. Cofinancing and funding from other sources will likewise be explored. The 2019 debt distress classification of Myanmar was assessed to be at low risk of debt distress.

5. ADB's firm lending pipeline (including regional projects) for Myanmar totals \$1,771.61 million during 2020–2022, including a carry-over of \$406.46 million from 2019 to be fully committed in 2020 (Appendix 3, Table A3.1). This exceeds indicative resources by \$1.71 million. It will focus on transport (44%); energy (23%); water and other urban infrastructure and services (10%); health (8%); public sector management (10%); and agriculture, natural resources, and rural development (5%).

6. The nonlending program for 2020–2022 will support project preparation and implementation, capacity development, and knowledge work (Appendix 3, Table A3.2). ADB will provide technical assistance (TA) through large regional TA projects or regional transaction TA facilities, with a sector or thematic focus. ADB will support relevant knowledge products, solutions, and events (Appendix 5) during the COBP period.

III. SUMMARY OF CHANGES TO LENDING AND NONLENDING PROGRAMS

7. Compared with the previous COBP, the 2020 lending pipeline (i) increased funding for the Yangon Urban Services Improvement Project to \$185.0 million; (ii) moved from 2019 the Enhancing Financial Access through the Public Credit Guarantee Scheme Project for \$60.0 million (new name); (iii) added Accelerated Rural Electrification Project for \$200.0 million and; and (iv) increased funding for Second GMS Highway Modernization Project to \$455.61 million.

8. The 2021 lending pipeline (i) moved Yangon Urban Transport Project to 2022 standby, (ii) moved Sustainable Power System Development Project to 2022 firm and reduced funding to \$200.0 million, (iii) added Improving Noncommunicable Diseases Prevention and Treatment Project for \$100.0 million, (iv) added Innovative Housing Finance Project for \$60.0 million, (v) added the GMS Cross-Border Livestock Health and Value Chains Improvement Project for \$90.0 million, (vi) renamed Enhancing Capacity of Sanitary and Phytosanitary Arrangement to Facilitate Trade in Myanmar to Innovations for Trade Promotion in Myanmar and increased funding to \$65.0 million, and (vii) renamed GMS Universal Health Care Project to GMS Healthy Border Special Economic Zones Project.
