global food and nutrition security

Challenges:

- More than 800 million people are hungry and more than two billion are suffering from micronutrient deficiencies;
- more than 162 million children under five are stunted and under-nutrition is the leading cause of child death;
- Growing population with 2 billion more mouths to feed by 2050

Complex issue:

 interlinked with poverty, climate change factors as well as increasing natural resources depletion, changing diets and other factors such as price volatility, conflict, gender inequality

The core is:

to connect growth, distribution and sustainability



our vision

The EU has undertaken high level political commitments, which are reflected in our priority areas:

- 1. agriculture for economic growth & job creation, enhancing private sector activities and agribusiness— *Private Sector Development* and inclusive agricultural growth priority
- promote a sustainable agriculture through its sustainable intensification: sustainable agriculture priority
- 3. support partner countries in reducing the number of stunted children by 7 million by 2025 and financial commitment for: a 3.5 billion Euro pledge made during the "Nutrition for Growth" G8 event on 8th June 2013-nutrition security and enhancement priority
- 4. build resilience and enhance crisis prevention & management against food crises- *systemic resilience to food crises priority*

Financial:


- 1. geographic programmes (country, regional, continental level)
- 2. thematic programmes (mainly global and continental)
- 3. total for the FNS/SA Sector: € 8.8 billion over 2014-2020 (80% geographic and 20% thematic)

Policy:

1. Processes: at global, continental and regional level and country level.

geographic programming:

60 developing countries with sustainable agriculture/food security as focal sector NIPs 2014-2020
