







Public procurement 'versus' Grants

Looking for opportunities to sell your services (or goods?)

Public contracts –
 awarded through calls for
 tender (public procurement)
 to buy services, supplies,
 works

Looking for money to fund your project?

 Grants – awarded through calls for proposals to cofinance specific projects or objectives





Services 'versus' Grants

Public Procurement Contract

- Contracting
 Authority (CA)
 defines the action
 (basis = ToR)
- CA finances 100%
- action can give rise to profits
- CA is « owner »


Grant Contract

- Grant beneficiary (GB) proposes the action (basis = guidelines)
- GB co-finances
- action cannot give rise to profits; noncommercial nature
- GB is « owner »






EU Cycle of operations and prospection





On-going contracts or signed < 31/12

- · Docs in force at signature
- In this case: signature = Contr. Auth.

Situation EDF

- Financial regulation 11th EDF will be aligned with FR Budget
- ! Rules applicable to EU BUDG also applicable to contract procedures EDF 10 (COT - annex IV - art 19c)

Contracts signed in 2013 and after

- Docs in force at moment of launching the procurement procedure
- => For international restricted Service tenders and open tenders Works: date of publication contract notice








Procurement process Services: steps?

Which trends in EU procurement?

- Larger contracts => bigger consortia
- Increased competition
- FWC versus comp. negotiated
- Quality of consortia and complementarity
- Organisation & methodology now more important than experts (60/40)
- Blending => procurement via investment banks





Tips & tricks (potential) providers

Monitor EU

 opportunities in an early stage

 Determine your expertise/ added value

 Adapt company CV & references (EU format)

- Promote yourself as a reliable partner to solid (lead) partners in consortia
 - references, specific/complementary expertise, field expertise incl. local, experts
- Develop internal expertise on EU development policies and acquisition opportunities
 - Know the PRAG and related doc, stay informed of updates (EuropeAid website, Permanent Rep., ...)


