 - the industrialised countries ICI



Public procurement 'versus' Grants

Looking for opportunities to sell your services (or goods?)

 Public contracts – awarded through calls for tender (public procurement) to buy services, supplies, works

Looking for money to fund your project?

 Grants – awarded through calls for proposals to cofinance specific projects or objectives





Services "versus" Grants

Public Procurement Contract

- Contracting
 Authority (CA)
 defines the action
 (basis = ToR)
- CA finances 100%
- action can give rise to profits
- CA is « owner »

Grant Contract


- Grant beneficiary (GB) proposes the action (basis = guidelines)
- GB co-finances
- action cannot give rise to profits; noncommercial nature
- GB is « owner »






Service tender procedures PRAG 2012

- International restricted
 - ≥ 200,000 €
- Framework contracts
 - < 200,000
 - Beneficiairies, Commission,




- < 200,000 €
- Competitive negotiated single offer
 - < 10,000 €







International restricted service tender







Tips & tricks (potential) service providers

Monitor EU
 opportunities in an
 early stage

 Determine your expertise/added value

Adapt company CV & references (EU format)

- Promote yourself as a reliable partner to solid (lead) partners in consortia
 - references, specific/complementary expertise, field expertise incl. local, experts
- Develop internal expertise on EU development policies and acquisition opportunities
 - Know the PRAG and related doc, stay informed of updates (EuropeAid website, Permanent Rep., ...)





From 2013 onwards – a snapshot

- New Financial Regulations & RAP enter into force 1 January 2013 (Budget)
- New PRAG 2013 and annexes



- Below 300,000 no obligatory use of FWC
 - CA has choice for either framework contract or competitive negotiated
- Procurement thresholds increased :
 - International restricted Se:> 300,000 €
 - Competitive negotiated single tender : < 20,000 €
 - Invoice < 2,500 €
