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### EU Enlargement process - Turkey

- Political stalemate as Turkey has not implemented additional protocol to extend Ankara agreement to all EU MS including Cyprus
- □ 13 chapters open Chapter 20 - Industrial and enterprise policy
- 8 related chapters frozen
   Chapter 1 (Free movement of goods) cannot be opened
- Work ongoing however in some important chapters for SMEs(Competition/State Aid; Public Procurement; Employment & Social Affairs)

# Competitiveness, trade, integration to global economy:

- ✓ Customs Union (Turkey in EU Single Market for goods) since 1996
- Total trade between EU and Turkey over € 100 bn/year
- ☑ Turkey is EU's 7th biggest trading partner.

### Share of manufacturing sector in Turkey's:

- ✓ total exports to EU: 82.4 %
- ✓ total imports from the EU: 76.4 %



# EU assistance on quality infrastructure

## ☑ What is behind manufacturing ? What does a production process contain of?

...regulatory environment, standards and methods, technical specifications, compliance with standards and regulations, testing, third party verification, verification of verifiers...

#### ☑ What happens after a product is put on the market?

... trade, technical barriers to trade, mutual recognition of technical legislation, or mutual recognition of test results, or mutual recognition of verifiers, market surveillance, product safety



# General Information about RCOP Projects

### Average budget: 7 to 10 million Euros:

- ✓ Technical Assistance (10 25 %)
- ☑ Equipment Supply (0 40 %)
- ✓ Construction (30 50 %)
- ✓ Construction Supervision (4 7 %)



### Average timeline for a project

Phase 1: Project development: 12 to 18 months

Phase 2: Prep. of tender dossiers: 8 to 12 months

Phase 3: Procurement

✓ Service: +/- 10 months

✓ Works: +/- 8 months

✓ Supply: +/- 7 months

Phase 4: Project Implementation: 24 to 36 months



## Procurement Opportunities RCOP

- ✓ 57 projects (already identified): @ 350 MEURO
- Appr. 20 projects (still to be identified): @ 300 MEURO
- @ 60 to 70 Technical Assistance Contracts

#### Forecast:

- 2011: 15 to 20 TA tenders to be launched
- 2012: 30 to 40 TA tenders to be launched
- 2013: 10 to 20 TA tenders to be launched

### **Consortium Building**

- ☑ No limit on the number of companies / partners of a consortium
- Each and every member has to fulfil the conditions indicated in the Procurement Notice
- Composition of consortia, once short-listed, cannot be changed
- A company can not join in different consortia for the same tender



### **Useful Tips**

- Visit (regularly) EuropeAid and CFCU web-sites
- Study Procurement Forecasts / Notices which are published
- Focus on the selection criteria (past experience / financial / technical requirements)
- Respect deadlines
- Highly competitive process
- Don't hesitate to ask for further clarifications
- BUT do not contact with CFCU / EU Delegation / End Recipients / OS during tendering (except for written clarification requests)
