## The EU as a humanitarian donor


- EU <u>largest donor</u> of humanitarian aid in the world
- Member States + Commission = more than half of official global humanitarian aid
- In 2007, Commission
  (ECHO) spent over
  €765 million, helping
  20 million crisis
  victims in more
  than 70 countries

## **Objectives**

Help victims of crises <u>outside</u> EU

Save and preserve life during emergencies

and their immediate aftermath

Provide relief to people affected by longer-lasting crises

- Protect victims of fighting
- Assist refugees and displaced people
- Short-term rehabilitation and reconstruction work
- Preparedness for natural disasters




## **Implementation**

- Commission = <u>active donor</u> 240 HQ staff + 100 experts in the field
- Humanitarian aid implemented by partner organisations:
  - → European NGOs
  - → UN agencies
  - → Red Cross/Red Crescentmovement
- Budget 2008> € 750 million

## Food and nutritional support

Examples: Basic food supplies, supplementary feeding for infants, special rations for malnourished people, seeds for farmers




## Shelter

Examples: Tents, plastic sheeting, building materials




### Water and sanitation

Examples: New wells and boreholes, water piping, latrines, sewage treatment, hygiene education



## Medical assistance

Examples: Vaccination campaigns, essential drugs, hospital equipment, primary health clinics



## Commission/ECHO's strengths

- Needs-based interventions no pre-conditions
- Operational efficiency and rapidity:
  Key <u>partner</u> for many relief agencies has helped to save millions of lives
- Rapid deployment of funds
- Technical expertise+ quality controlon the spot
- Commitment to 'forgotten crises'



## **Health Actions**


- 27% or EUR 2 Billion over the last 10 years (last year EUR 130 million)
- 180 projects in 32 countries;
- Mostly in conflict or conflict related countries
- 95 projects (53%) implemented in 5 countries only (Sudan, oPT, DRC, Liberia & Lebanon).

## **Activities**

- **Epidemics:** surveillance, preparedness and emergency response
- Primary Health Care: curative oriented with strong emphasis on improving access to health services and supply of essential drugs
- Secondary Health Care: specific departments in crucial hospitals are targeted: paediatrics, selective surgery, obstetrics, blood transfusion...
- Temporary health structures: only as a second choice if national system cannot absorb additional caseload
- Psycho-Social programmes

## **Type of interventions**

#### Distribution of main activities



- PHC
- Disease control
- Hospital care
- Outbreaks
- Psychosocial care & SGBV
- Essential drugs
- Nutrition rehabilitation
- Various

#### **Example: Health Action in Crisis / WHO**

#### Support to WHO for

- reinforcing response capacity of WHO in health emergencies
- Supporting the cluster approach and humanitarian reform

#### **Achievements**

- WHO presence in most crises countries
- Capacity and performance of staff have improved
- Standard operating procedures for emergency response
- Increased political commitment at all levels of the organisation
- Engagement with health partners at global and country level

#### Under development

Health and Nutrition Tracking Service: obtain consistent data on mortality, under nutrition assessments.

## **Evaluation of Health Activities (2007)**

DG ECHO is an important donor in the health sector, with particular advantages in comparison to other donors being its in-country presence, its proximity to affected populations, its diverse partnerships, its focus on forgotten crises and its funding flexibility.

These comparative advantages could be exploited more.

### Recommendations

- To provide clarity on funding;
- To participate more in health fora to match funding levels and maximise opportunities to influence sector debates;
- To more systematically utilise available health expertise;
- To develop and support consistent use of technical guidelines;
- To retain negotiating space for funding of activities that straddle the boundaries of humanitarian assistance

## Follow up: health policies

#### **EU Consensus**

Community will promote value-added sectoral policies based on international best practice in specific policy areas

#### **Current work**

- Medical experts and network (Anopheles)
- ► (Funding) Policy guidance on a number of issues, such as HIV/AIDS and User Fees.
- Technical guidance on polio, nutrition, psychosocial support, bed nets, etc.
- Presence of DG ECHO in international fora and supporting initiatives (Health and Nutrition Tracking Service)
- Use of expertise of partner organisations and leveraging funding
- Consultation of Member States, partners and stakeholders

## **Example: HIV/AIDS guidelines**

- Funding guidelines
- Context of emergencies and dilemmas
- Wide consultation
- Outcome: no vertical programmes, but:
  - Explaining specific mandate
  - ► Follow international standards
  - Mainstreaming in actions
  - Specific funding guidance (health, food)
  - ► Implementation

## **Current issues and challenges**

- European Consensus on Humanitarian aid
- Address "cross-cutting issues" like:
  - → LRRD Linking Relief,
     Rehabilitation and
     Development
  - → disaster preparedness
  - → children and gender
- **Security** of relief workers
- Climate change (malaria)
- Rising food prices (€ impact)
- Communication
